FIRST THOUGHTS

We have arrived. Culture is where they said it would be. Who you ask? The men who penned the Scriptures as the Holy Spirit inspired. Isaiah wrote, ""Were they ashamed because of the abomination they have done? They were not even ashamed at all; They did not even know how to blush" (Jeremiah 6:15). Timothy wrote, "For the time will come when they will not endure sound doctrine; but wanting to have their ears tickled, they will accumulate for themselves teachers in accordance with their own desires and will turn away their ears from truth and will turn aside to myths" (2 Timothy 4:3-4).

Our culture has arrived exactly where our God said it would. This week New York state signed into law a bill that allows abortion up until the moment before birth (with smiles all around).
